Supermarket Shopping


8:30am to 11:00am

Senior Citizen Residential Repair Program




The Town of Babylon Residential Repair Program is offering residents (aged 60 and over) minor home repairs. Residents must be incapable of maintaining their homes because of illness, incapacity, handicap or absence of a caretaker. Repairs are meant to remediate substandard, unsuitable or unsafe residences.

The Residential Repair Program provides the worker and the recipients are expected to pay for the necessary supplies and materials.

The repairs include but are not limited to:

- Handicapped modifications
- Crime prevention modification
- Clean gutters
- Install hand rails
- Installation and repair of grab bars
- Rake leaves
- Paint
- Minor plumbing



The Residential Repair Program covers minor projects and **does not include** projects which require licensed contractors.

The program does not provide for SNOW REMOVAL .

Funding is limited and preference will be given to older individuals with the greatest economic needs.

Thanksgiving Celebrations Around the World

Do you ever wonder how other countries celebrate holidays and special occasions? Let see how a few other countries celebrate Thanksgiving....

*Canadian...*they began celebrating Thanksgiving before us. When the explorer Martin Frobisher landed in Newfoundland, Canada he celebrated with a small feast to give thanks and celebrate safe travels to the new land. On the second Monday of October families gather together and enjoy turkey, stuffing and pie very similar to our celebration here in America.

*China...*they celebrate with a Mid-Autumn Moon Festival. Family and friends come together the end of the harvest with a grand feast. The actual day of celebration is on the 15th day of the 8th lunar month usually in the months of September or October. Legend has it the moon is at its brightest and roundest on this day. They celebrate with mooncakes, a flaky pastry stuffed with sweet or savory filling.

*Korea...*Chuseok. Celebrated in September or October it is a time for families to come together to share food, stories and honor their ancestors. They enjoy a dish called Songpyeon, which is rice kneaded into cakes filled with red beans, chestnuts and other ingredients. The family will visit the graveyard but also enjoys dancing, wrestling and dressing in traditional costumes.

*Germany...*religious holiday that often takes place on the first Sunday of October, **Erntedankfest** is a harvest festival that gives thanks for a good year and good fortune. During the festivities one may wear an Erntekrone, a harvest crown made of grain, flowers, and fruit. Fattened chickens (die Masthühnchen), hens (die Poularde), roosters (der Kapaun), and geese (die Gans) are favored for the feast.



Let's Talk Turkey



All we can ask for is a happy and healthy holiday season. Don't let your turkey be the culprit for making others sick. Learn more about proper techniques of thawing, cooking, serving and storing your holiday bird.

THAW

- *Refrigerator- Place frozen turkey in the refrigerator. Allow approximately 24 hours for every 4-5 lbs. of bird.*
- *Cold water- Submerge the bird in cold water and change water every 30 minutes.*

COOK

- *Your bird is not safe to serve until it reaches 165° F. If the bird is stuffed, the stuffing must also reach 165° F.*

Using a meat thermometer, check these 3 places for best food safety practice:

1. *The thickest part of the breast*
2. *Innermost part of the wing*
3. *Innermost part of the thigh*

SERVE

- *Once removed from the oven, let the turkey sit for 20 minutes before carving to let the juices settle.*
- *Take your time at the table but be sure to refrigerate leftovers within 2 hours.*

STORE

- *Leftover turkey can be stored in the refrigerator for 3-4 days and can be stored in the freezer for 2-6 months.*
- *If traveling, be sure to pack leftover turkey in a cooler with ice.*
